Better Places Program

Richard shared an update on the process and elements of this program. Better Places is a non-competitive, community matching grant program empowering Vermonters to create inclusive and vibrant public places serving Vermont's designated downtowns, village centers, new town centers, or neighborhood development areas. The program provides one-on-one project coaching, local fundraising support, and two to one (2:1) matching grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$40,000 to make your community-led placemaking ideas happen.

\$1 Million for Tree Planting

Gov. Scott's 2022 proposed budget includes \$1 million for UCF to plant up to 5,000 trees in urban areas to mitigate impacts of climate change. Our team has started thinking about how to utilize the funding. Council reviewed UCF list of ideas. Feedback includes:

- Can money be used to improve infrastructure to enhance places where the trees will be planted?
- Support for fruit/nut trees; connection to edible walk?
- Bare root tree distribution is time sensitive and needs to be well organized.
- Make room for planting on rooftops?
- Connect to urban heat island

- How to integrate into existing plans; imagine what climate change planning is; put more into what they are doing, identifying gaps
- Where can trees play a solution? Feed into other programs; move from planning to implementation
- Ways to connect with VTrans projects and help inform designs in coordination with infrastructure investment?
- It might be useful to think about how long these trees need to live for in order to accomplish the climate objectives.
- Strategic investment office- state money is not coordinated; lots of missed opportunities!

Legislative Update

Director of Forestry Danielle Fitzko shared an update on the current legislative session and what legislation might impact UCF's work and forests in VT in general.

• H697 Use Value Appraisal Program- bill to expand UVA program to include reserved forest land category (parcels with no management); parcels would be eligible if 30% has ecological values to conserve with no management (natural communities/steep slopes/riparian areas); would have to do

restorative management ie. invasive plants or address water quality issues.

- Biodiversity protection- essentially a conservation plan for the state to see how state will meet conservation design targets; establishes goals 30% conserved by 2030.
- H566 Forest Futures Strategic Road Map: modeled after farm to plate; planning effort on where legislature can assists road map for forest economy.
- H651 Environmental Justice Bill: will establish policy, create a council on how to meet needs, assess
 impact of environmental issues; would create a mapping tool to identify where to strategically invest.
 (Maybe \$5million?)
- Act 250: constantly changing and in many committees; doesn't look likely anything will change this session.
