What key role have you played in your town forest?

"Once the town acquired the land, we had the responsibility of developing a management plan, and it was critical in moving the community toward thinking more holistically about the value of the town forest."

What do folks like to do here?

"Hunting, mountain biking, running, hiking, some horseback riding. Preschool teachers and kids do storybook walks that feature nature. And oftentimes teachers use it as an outdoor classroom."

What is your most remarkable takeaway from your experiences here?

"I am appreciative of this beautiful resource, and thankful that it's sustainably managed to maintain its biodiversity and economic value to the town."
