in Vermont, stewarding trees and forests is a way of life; and WHEREAS, WHEREAS, trees and forests are integral to our individual and community well-being; and WHEREAS. trees and forests cover nearly 75% of Vermont's landscape - cleaning air and water, reducing stormwater runoff, retaining soil and slowing floods, sequestering and storing carbon, supporting biodiversity, and providing habitat for wildlife and for us; and trees and forests support our local economy by creating a sense of place, offering WHEREAS, natural and renewable resources, and sustaining jobs in arboriculture, forestry, logging, recreation, crafts and trades; and trees and forests support all who live, work, and play among them by keeping us WHEREAS, healthy, alleviating stress, providing shade and beauty, and encouraging recreation; and WHEREAS. it is essential to ensure equitable access to the benefits of trees and forests for all Vermonters, regardless of socioeconomic status, race, or geographic location; and WHEREAS, Arbor Day serves as a reminder of the importance of tree planting, preservation, and environmental stewardship, inspiring individuals and communities to take action to preserve and protect our environment and shared spaces; and the first Friday in May is designated as the day for Vermonters to unite in celebration WHEREAS. of trees and forests.
